



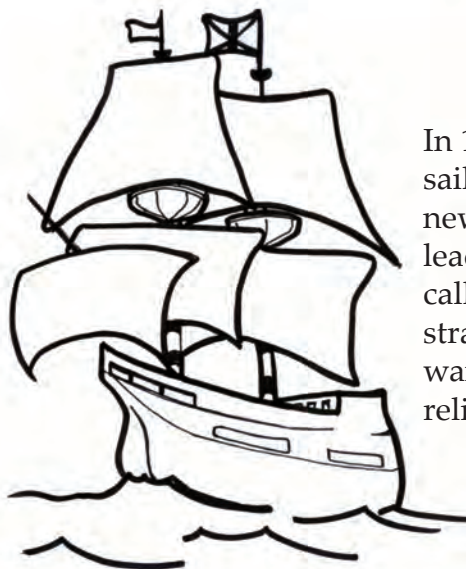
William Tyndale made King Henry VIII angry too. King Henry liked everyone to do what he said, but Tyndale followed what the Bible said.

On October 6, 1536 Tyndale was burned at the stake for heresy (going against the church.)



By 1566 some people in England were complaining that the Church of England was too much like the Roman Church. They wanted it to be more simple and pure. They were called Puritans.

Puritans were not popular in England because they wanted more freedom in the church. Some of them had to leave England and move to Holland.



In 1620 some of these Puritans sailed on the Mayflower to new land in America. Their leader William Bradford called them "pilgrims and strangers on the earth." They wanted to live in a place with religious freedom.
