Ancestral File Update

On June 25th, 1992 fifteen descendants of Phineas W. Cook gathered at the Family History Library for the purpose of preparing an official family sponsored submittal to the Church Ancestral File. We used Personal Ancestral File information prepared by a number of different family members. After nearly a years's worth of checking, comparing, verifying and rechecking, we're happy to let you know that the 61 group sheets previously prepared by the Phineas Wolcott Cook Family Organization have now been entered into the computer and are being submitted to the Ancestral File of the Family History Department. This means that family members everywhere can have easy access to all the research that has been done over the years by so many faithful researchers.

That's the good news. The bad news is that the Ancestral File will not be updated with this information for about another year. It seems that the information submitted in 1991 is not scheduled to appear on the Ancestral File until later this summer. What we are submitting now won't be incorporated into the Church computer system until sometime next year.

MORE GOOD NEWS! Those of you who want this information right away can get it on a computer disc and install it on your home computer using the GEDCOM function of the Personal Ancestral File. If you would like a disc copy please contact me and include the following information:

High Intensity or Regular density disks?

If you're in a hurry to receive this information, I can send it to you now. However, you may wish to wait until May, when the file will contain additional ordinance information.

After reviewing and verifying all the information on our groups sheets, we submitted the file to Temple Ready (a program which clears names for temple work). In the process about 50 additional names were cleared for Temple ordinances and sealings. The names are being submitted to the Jordan River Temple and will be available there in the family name file for family members to complete temple ordinances.

We would like to invite you to be part of that experience. We have scheduled a date to meet as a family to do this work. If you can, plan to join us at the Jordan River Temple at 8:00am on Saturday, May 15th. We'll do the initiatory, endowment, and sealing work for as many names as we can that morning. After the session we'll have a short family meeting and enjoy lunch together in the Temple Cafeteria. Hope you can make it.

FUTURE SUBMISSIONS TO THE ANCESTRAL FILE

Undoubtedly there will be future changes, corrections, additions, etc... to the information we have submitted to the Ancestral File. In order to avoid duplication and mistakes we recommend that when you have corrections to this

information you submit them through the family organization, rather than directly to the Church. In this way, we can update our file, and notify family members, then edit the ancestral file, instead of submitting a complete new pedigree.. If you have questions about this, please contact one of the family officers.

Our beloved wife, mother, grandmother, sister and friend, Clella Cook Fluckiger Glazier, age 87, passed away peacefully Dec. 19, 1992, in the LDS hospital, in Salt Lake City, Utah after a short illness.

Clella was born October 8, 1905, in Afton, Wyoming, the daughter of Carl Cook (son of Phineas Wolcott Cook) and Ella Call Cook. She married Wilford Ulrich Fluckiger on Sept. 9, 1925, in the Salt Lake Temple. He preceded her in death on November 9, 1971. She married Roy Glazier on Aug. 9, 1976, in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. He preceded her in death on Oct. 10, 1983.

She was extremely devoted to her family and to the Church. In her later years she dedicated much of her time to temple work. She also provided a living for herself by managing property. She traveled extensively and in her last years made a special effort to visit family members across the country. She was a member of the DUP and studied Esperanto, attended singles activities in her ward and went to the cannery at every opportunity.

LETTERS FROM OUR MISSIONARIES

Dear Family Cook Members,

I am finding that the extended Phineas Wolcott Cook Family Organization is a lot larger than I had known before I started getting involved in the organization. I was asked to be in the organization early in the year of 1992 but because my wife and I were planning a mission in the fall of the year I was unable to attend any of the meetings that year. We were called to serve in the Fiji Suva Mission and we went to the Islands in November but due to illness we were sent back to Salt Lake for doctors care and assigned to the family history mission. Since entering this mission I have met several cousins I had never heard of. We meet in a devotional each five day week morning and soon after our missions start we are asked to give a ten minute condensed life sketch. Shortly after my turn two or three people have made it known that we have a common ancestry. Some are second cousins, great Uncles or Aunts from the same Grandparents I have.

We are serving at the Granite Mountain Vaults doing about the most routine work one could do and loving it. We help wind, label and file the thousands of film stored there. It is a work I would not choose as a vocation but as a missionary and a member of the Lords true church we pay our way and a day never goes by that we do not have a spiritual experience. The hired crew who work there along with the fourteen missionaries have a good relationship and the spirit of the Lord is strong in the Lords Holy Mountain.

My current assignment in the family organization is to up date the descending pedigree file of our Grandparents Melvin Phineas and Ruth Tyler Cook. In 1981 my sister Mary Stringham and I turned in a chart current to July of that year. There were about three hundred names on that list and I am sure the numbers have nearly doubled in the last twelve years. It is our intent to gather all of the names, births and birth dates of all children born since July 1, 1981 and add them to the existing file. This file includes all of the grand children of Melvin and Ruth and all great grand children born before July 1. Charles and Pearl Rawsons daughter, Betty is the last entry on the list. Would I be asking too much of the parents of the great grand children of Grampa and Grandma Cook to be responsible for seeing to it that this information is sent to us as soon as possible? We also need the names of all who married in the last twelve years and the names of their spouses and where they are living so that we can get their names on the list to receive the news letter.

I have a computer with me and am working on a format to put all of this information on a disc to be submitted to the total organization as well as making it available to any family members who want it. This is going to take some time and the best time I can think of for doing it is when I am on a mission and totally devoted to getting this work done. Other interests seem to hog out time when we are at home.

Our Great Grand Parents Phineas Wolcott Cook and Ann Eliza Howland Cook left us a heritage that is almost unequalled. I find that nearly if not all of their posterity are active members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Their great example of pure faith, hard work and sacrifice set a precedence that took hold of the souls of their posterity and never let go. May we never let them down.

Consider selecting a project from the following:

1. Local research in Genesee, Erie Counties, New York. Look in local probate records, newspapers, cemetery records.

2. Local research in Ontario County, New York. Elizabeth may have died in this county. We know she and Joseph lived there for a year after leaving Connecticut (they bought no property.)

3. Local research in Goshen or Litchfield County, Connecticut. Newspapers and other local records may be our best place to find clues to Elizabeth Porter's family, the possibility of the existence of a daughter Eliza Cook, and maybe the death of either.

4. Research project. Adopt an Ancestor of your choice either from Phineas Wolcott's family or one of the wives' families. There are many projects to do, in many states of the union. Perhaps one would be just right for you.

1. You choose an ancestor from the list. To do this you will have to contact Janet Porter or come to the family research workshop (No. 2 below.)

2. Meet with the family

research group the first Tuesday of every month from 10am to noon or 6-9 p.m. at the Genealogy Library in Salt Lake City. At least in the beginning we will meet at the main desk. Each time a notice will be posted on the bulletin board about where to find us. I will be at the library all day to help anyone who needs it.

3. Contact Janet Porter for research information and a plan of action in finding this ancestor. If you wish, detailed plans will be discussed so you will know exactly what to do.

4. Get to know this ancestor by reading local histories, verify dates, writing for information and having microfilm records sent to you from Salt Lake. Find out as much as you can and then if possible look beyond to that person's parents. Much of this can be done as easily where you live as in Salt Lake, and in some cases, perhaps even better.

5. Submit occasional progress reports to Janet Porter. Perhaps eventually you will have enough biographical information that an article could be written about this ancestor in the family newsletter.

You will be the only person who will ever do this research, as there isn't time for any one person to do it all. It will be something your family gets involved in, your vacations can be planned around it, etc.

You'll never regret it!

Maybe it already does. It does me and this is only the beginning of what is soon to come. May we be ready to make use of it as it comes at us.
